2008 Olympic Games**



TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1 Competition and Entry Details

1.1 In these terms and conditions:

‘AOC’ means the Australian Olympic Committee

‘Competition’ means the ‘Show your Support’ Message Competition

‘Entrant’ means the school who has submitted the entry

‘Entry’ means that entry for the Competition submitted by the Entrant

‘Judges’ means the panel comprised of Australian Olympic Committee, Australian Olympic Committee Athletes’ Commission and State Olympic Council representatives.

‘Olympic values’ are the values determined by the International Olympic Committee of excellence, friendship and respect.

‘Podcast’ means a digital media file (audio or video) or a series of such files, that is distributed over the internet using syndication feeds for playback on portable media players and personal computers.

1.2 The Competition is only open to primary schools throughout Australia. The competition is not open to individual students. Only one Entry per Entrant will be accepted.

1.3 By submitting an Entry, the Entrant agrees to be bound by these terms and conditions

1.4 Approval and contact details from the principal or an authorised representative of the Entrant must be evidenced on the official entry form.

1.5 The Entry must be received by the AOC no later than 5pm AEST on Friday 30 May 2008.

1.6 The Entry must be submitted online at www.bkzone.com.au and accompanied by a completed online official entry form.

1.7 Entrants must ensure students work together to create the school entry.

1.8 The Entry must be original work and must not contain any material that infringes the rights of another person, including intellectual property or moral rights.

1.9 The Entry must comply with the guidelines as outlined in the competition.

1.10 By submitting an Entry, the Entrant agrees the ownership of the Entry, including all intellectual property rights, will automatically be assigned to and rest with the AOC. By assigning their rights to the AOC it will also allow the AOC to publish to the public without a fee.

1.11 By submitting an Entry, the Entrant warrants that they have obtained any necessary consent to acts or omissions performed by or on behalf of the AOC which would, but of this clause infringe the author’s right of attribution of authorship or integrity of authorship.

1.12 By submitting an Entry, the Entrant warrants that they have obtained the necessary permission to photograph/film a child and publish to the public.

1.13 The AOC reserves the right to disqualify, without notice, any Entry that is late or does not comply with these terms and conditions, including the criteria listed below.

1.14 The AOC reserves the right to refuse to accept any Entry for any reason, including but not limited to an Entry contrary that contains material which is defamatory, offensive, contrary to standards of decency or the Olympic Values or has been submitted in bad faith.

1.15 Entries submitted to the Competition will not be returned to Entrants

2 Entry Specifications

The Entry must adhere to the following specifications:

- Have a title
- Convey a message of support for the Australian Olympic Team
- Entries must be submitted as an audio file (.wma, .mp3, or .wav) or video file (.avi, .mov, .mp4, .mpeg, or .wmv) with a size of less than 10MB.
- Entries must be submitted with an accompanying image 160 pixels wide by 120 pixels high.
- Of 60 – 90 seconds in duration
- Original, creative and easily understood.
- Supplied online at www.bkzone.com.au
- Where possible, messages should be drawn from the outcomes of existing class work.
- Entries must be coordinated and submitted by the school teacher (or authorised representative).

2.2 All entries eligible for the competition will be published in the BK Zone. If the entry is not published, the message has not complied with file requirements and/or the Terms and Conditions

3 Selecting the Winners

3.1 The Judges will select:

- A first place winner from each State and Territory; and
- Endorse the 'people's choice' award

3.2 The Judges will consider the specifications when judging entries.

3.3. Winning entries will be those judged to have presented an original and creative message in support of the Australian Olympic Team in the correct format.

3.4 The Judges decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

3.5 The winning Entries will be announced by the AOC on 23 June 2008.

4 Privacy

4.1 Any personal information provided by Entrants will not be used for any purpose other than the purposes of the Competition, except by consent or as required by law.

5 Prizes

- 5.1 Winning entries will be shown to the 2008 Australian Olympic Team at the Australian Olympic Team Reception, 7 August 2008 in Beijing China.
- 5.2 The schools of the winning entries will receive an item of Australian Olympic Memorabilia, signed by members of the Australian Olympic Team and a DVD of the montage played at the 2008 Australian Olympic Team Reception
- 5.3 Physical prizes will be sent to schools on 15 September 2008.

6 Participation, Postponement, Variation, Cancellation and Withdrawal

- 6.1 The AOC may, at its sole discretion and without prejudice to any other right, cancel, terminate, postpone, modify, or suspend the Competition or part thereof for any reason, or take any other action it considers appropriate, including disqualifying an Entrant. This will include the right to cancel the Competition in the event that fewer than five Entries from each State and Territory are received by 30 May 2008.
- 6.2 If the AOC becomes aware after the prizes have been awarded that a winning Entry does not meet the Competition terms and conditions then the relevant Entrant:
 - (a) has no entitlement, right or interest in the prize and
 - (b) will be required at the discretion of the AOC to return, refund or otherwise make restitution of the prizeIn the event that the AOC cancels or postpones the Competition, or part thereof:
 - (a) it shall not be required to conduct the Competition at any other time; and
 - (b) it shall not be liable to any person for any loss or damage arising out of, or in connection with, the cancellation of the Competition; (including, without limitation, liability for negligence); and
 - (c) it will not be required to award the prize to any Entrant.
- 6.3 The AOC, including its employees, agents and contractors, is not liable for any injury, loss or damage to any Entrant or school student including any injury, loss or damage to any Entry, resulting from, either directly or indirectly, participating in the Competition.
